January Snowflake Block


Unfinished block size will be 9 ½"
Finished block size of 9"
You will need:
One 10" square of background fabric in white or cream
One 8" square of snowflake color: light blue, grey or pale lavender

Thread to match snowflake fabric Fusible web of your choice

Instructions:

- 1. Trace Gingham Girls' Snowflake pattern onto paper side of fusible web of your choice.
- 2. Follow the instructions for fusible web and make a snowflake of an icy color (i.e. light blue, grey, lavender)
- 3. Fuse completed snowflake onto the center of a 10" white or cream background and use applique stitch of your choice in matching thread color to sew to background.
- 4. Trim block to 9 ½".

Because of all of the severe angles I thought it would be easier to use the above method of applique over needle turn. I do know we have some very talented hand appliquers. If you prefer needle turn applique, please feel free to try that method. I will not stand in your way.
